## **How to Participate**

The Achiever is open to all minority teens (grades 6 - 12) from all social and academic levels in Union County.

Teens must complete an application form and be committed to attend and participate in workshops and events.

There is no minimum GPA requirement and the program, including SAT Prep and materials, is free of cost.

Graduating HS seniors are eligible to apply for college scholarships both fall/spring semester.

The year-long test prep program follows the academic school year and is offered on a 6 week rotation.
