The renovated facility will open in late 2023 as the Cranford YMCA and will feature fitness, aquatic and other programs.

NEW FAMILY LOCKER ROOM AT THE MAIN Y

The new expanded Family Locker Room opened in September. The Family Locker Room is designated for individuals who require assistance, have special/adaptive needs, or adults accompanying small children.

The Locker Room includes 12 individualized handicapped-accessible changing spaces that each contain a shower, grab bar, and bench. There are also two handicapped-accessible bathrooms in the new space.

Now in progress is the construction of a dedicated locker room for girls ages 17 and under to be completed by year's end. Subsequent renovations will take place in the following order: the Boy's Locker Room, both Silver Locker Rooms, and the Gold Locker Rooms.

For several years, the Westfield Area YMCA Capital Improvement Project has focused on ADA-compliance, safety and facility enhancements with a goal of equal accessibility for all.

Devilfish is a developmental and competitive year-round program that provides a high level of training and professional instruction for swimmers ages 6-18.

OUR CENTENNIAL YEAR IN REVIEW

With only a few months left in 2023, we're ready to look back at the wonderful year we've had celebrating and commemorating a century of community impact.

TREASURE IN THE WALLS OF THE Y

Earlier this spring, members of our facilities staff found two time capsules in the cornerstones of the Main facility. The first one discovered was from 1962, the year that the Wallace Pool and gymnasium were added on.

Finding the first one led to an even more fascinating discovery—an older time capsule from when the original cornerstone was laid and the building was constructed in 1927. The capsule had been soldered shut, leaving the 96 year old contents inside in near-pristine condition.

An original proposal for a designated Y facility, a program and invitation for the cornerstone laying ceremony, and written histories were amongst the items included inside.



Also enclosed were copies of the Y Campaigner, a daily newspaper outlining the progress of a 10-day building fund campaign in 1927. The campaign raised \$300,000, roughly \$5.2 million in today's dollars!

The time capsules will be reinserted into to the cornerstones at the end of the year, with the addition of some special items and photos from our centennial year.


